



BOREDOM DOESN'T STAND A CHANCE HERE!

The Kielce region, beautiful and captivating, is rich in unique and historic sacral, military, manorial and industrial sites. Many of the wonders of nature to be seen here are covered by a variety of forms of protection, the premier example of which is the Świętokrzyski National Park. Geographically speaking, the area includes the Świętokrzyskie Mountains, with the main ranges being the Lysogóry range and the Suchedniów Highlands. Though not among the tallest of mountains - the highest points of the Lysogóry range are Lysica at 613.31 m above sea level and Agata at 613.96 m above sea level - they are still highly enjoyable for both beginners and advanced hikers.

The Kielce region also boasts a dense network of hiking and cycling trails which attract visitors looking to spend their time actively. The ski stations located in the mountains entice winter sports fans with runs that are ideal no matter if you're just starting out or if you have years of experience. The Kielce region is also known as "the largest outdoor geological museum" due to the stony cliffs, stone runs (gołoborze), karst caves, boulders and mining heaps dotted around the area which allow visitors to get a close-up look at the geological history of the region.

In a word, everyone will find something for themselves here! Boredom doesn't stand a chance!






HISTORICAL TOURISM - YOUR NEW DISCOVERIES

Over the centuries, the residents of the Kielce region have left behind historic reminders of their presence, which today constitute a fascinating history lesson. Stefan Żeromski, the Nobel Prize winner Henryk Sienkiewicz, Jan Gajzler and Adolf Dygasiński are just some of the historical figures associated with the region whose prose and poetry have immortalised the beauty of this land. In many places, such as Kielce, Ciekoty and Oblęgorek, visitors can see family mementos and objects which reflect the lives and creative work of these artists. Rich in natural resources, the Kielce region has been an important industrial hub since ancient times, and the fascinating remains of mines, ancient foundries, smelting furnaces, waterworks and

production halls can still be seen to this day. Just visit Nowa Słupia, Samsonów or Bobrza to feel the spirit of places which were once part of the Old-Polish Industrial Zone. If you're looking for quaint and atmospheric spots, meanwhile, you should definitely pay a visit to Chęciny, Chmielnik, Bodzentyn or Szydłów. The historic secular and sacral architectural sites in these places will take you back to the Middle Ages and later eras. And don't miss the Holy Cross sanctuary, with its more than 1,000 years of tradition, where relics of the True Cross are preserved along with other sacral objects hiding their own mysteries which are well worth seeing.



ACTIVE TOURISM - THE THRILL OF ADVENTURE

Thrill-seekers, fans of active relaxation and travel buffs will all find much to enjoy in the Kielce region. Starting from hiking and cycling trips, through equestrian sports, kayaking, sailing, skiing, the possibility of flying in a variety of gliders and light sport aircraft, rock climbing and riding on a motocross track, there is simply so much to do. It's well worth taking a hike on the red trail which runs along the Lysogóry range from Święta Katarzyna to Nowa Słupia, or

alternatively enjoy a ride on the Green Velo cycling trail. Tourists travelling by car can follow thematically organised routes, among the most important of which are the Literary Route, the Świętokrzyski Wooden Architecture Route and the Archaeological and Geological Route. In winter, make sure to visit Kielce, Tumlin, Niestachów, Krajno and Bodzentyn, where skiing fans will find plenty of well-prepared slopes. Adventure calls!



NATURE TOURISM - A LAND OF ATTRACTIONS

The Świętokrzyski National Park, created in 1950 as the second Polish national park, and the region's 9 landscape parks, nature reserves, and many individual monuments of nature, such as the 1,000-year-old historic Bartek oak tree or the Jaskinia Raj cave, are protected areas due to their natural, historical, cultural and (primarily) scenic value. The characteristic features of the landscape of the Kielce region and the Świętokrzyski Mountains are steep slopes, deeply scored valleys and gołoborze stone runs (on Łysica and Łysiec mountains). The forested parts of the area are dominated by fir (Puszcza Jodłowa) and beech trees. The

landscape of the Kielce region, including the shallow valleys of the Świętokrzyskie Mountains, are dominated by the so-called "Kielce chessboard" phenomenon, a mosaic effect of many small fields caused by the high extent of agricultural fragmentation in the area. When travelling through the Kielce region, whether on foot or by bike, among the fields and forests or through the towns and cities, visitors can discover places with centuries-old history and historic sites which commemorate important events while blending beautifully into the natural environment.

















RETRACING ŚWIĘTOKRZYSKI **HISTORY**

9.30 Sightseeing in the ruins of Checiny Castle, the most heavily fortified Polish medieval fortress, later used as a prison for political rivals and royal widows. Legend has it that the walls of the castle are haunted by the White Lady.

11.00 Kielce Countryside Museum in Tokarnia - in an open space covering more than 70 hectares, you can admire many historic wooden buildings relocated from the countryside, including the Church of Our Lady of Consolation, a farmstead from Daleszyce, a windmill from Grzmucin, a peasant's cottage from Siekierno and a manor house from Suchedniów.

12:30 Sightseeing in Podzamcze Chęcińskie (including the Checiny Starostas' Manor, a triumphal arch and Italianate garden).

14.30 Transport to Oblegorek and visit to the Henryk Sienkiewicz Museum, the summer residence of the famous Polish writer.

16.30 Transport to and walk around Kielce, taking in Kadzielnia, the most beautiful former quarry in Poland, the Walk of Fame, the Wild Boar monument, Stanisław Staszic Park, the cathedral with a historic table of measurements, the Palace of Kraków Bishops and the charming boardwalk, ul. Sienkiewicza.

19.00 Transport for the night to the hotel, and dinner.





8.00 Breakfast.

9.00 Setting out for sightseeing with a guide.

10.30 Holy Cross Monastery is the oldest sanctuary in Poland, founded in the early 11th century by King Bolesław Chrobry. The site is well-known for the relics stored here which were brought by the Benedictines in the 13th century. The itinerary includes visiting the Church of the Holy Trinity with its relics and precious paintings made by Franciszek Smuglewicz, seeing the crypt where the remains of Jeremi Wiśniowiecki, bane of the Cossacks, rest in eternity, and going up an observation tower for a view over the unique natural attraction of the gołoborze stone run.

14.00 Transport to and sightseeing in Święta Katarzyna, a village situated at the foot of Lysica mountain with the church and convent of St. Catherine of Alexandria, a chapel dedicated to Stefan Żeromski and a sacred spring dedicated to St. Francis.

15.30 Transport to and sightseeing in Bodzentyn - a charming town at the foot of the Góra Miejska hill. The schedule includes the option of visiting the ruins of the castle of Florian of Mokrsko, the Collegiate Church of the Assumption of the Holy Virgin Mary and St. Stanislaus, and the historic Czernikiewicz family farm.

18.00 Arrival at the hotel, and dinner.

RETRACING ŚWIĘTOKRZYSKI HISTORY

KIELCE REGION



8.00 Breakfast.

9.00 Check-out, and then setting out for sightseeing with a guide.

10.00 Ruins of the Huta Józef foundry in Samsonów during the times of the Jagiellonian dynasty, this was the largest centre for armaments manufacture in Poland, though it is currently in a state of ruin. The still extant hoisting tower and remains of the main furnace continue to amaze visitors.

11.00 Bobrza - an unrealised dream of the might of the Polish metallurgy industry. The itinerary includes the option of visiting a unique hydropower plant set on the Bobrza river, with its attendant retaining wall, coal rooms and storage buildings.

12.30 Kuźniaki - the option of visiting the smallest ironsmelting furnace in the Old-Polish Industrial Zone.

13.30 Lunch, and return home.

Arrival in Krajno.

10.00 Sabat Krajno Miniature Park and Entertainment Complex - a rope park with zip lines which take visitors over the world-famous Sydney Opera House and Niagara Falls.

8.00 Breakfast.

9.00 Setting off for the Świętokrzyskie Mountains.

10.00 The Łysogóry range on foot - hiking along the red trail through the Łysogóry range from the Lubrzanka river valley to Święta Katarzyna, and further to Trzcianka via Łysica, Kakonin, Huta Szklana and Łysa Góra, to the oblate monastery of the Holy Cross. The trail runs through the highest parts of the Świętokrzyskie Mountains and

Świętokrzyski National Park. In terms of scenery, it is one of the most beautiful hiking trails in Poland, covering a distance of 35 km.

14.00 Lunch.

18.30 End of the hiking trip through the Lysogóry range.

19.30 Arrival at the hotel.

20.00 Dinner.




DAY 3

8.00 Breakfast.

9.00 Setting out for sightseeing of the Kielce area by bike - a cycling journey through the mountain ranges of the western Świętokrzyskie Mountains. Visitors can ride on a section of the recently marked Green Velo Cycling Trail on the Sielpia-Kielce stretch.

The trail runs from Sielpia through the Suchedniów-Oblęgorek Landscape Park to Oblęgorek, and further through Chełmce, Podzamcze Piekoszowskie, Szczukowice and Karczówka to the centre of Kielce. The trail is about 70 km long.

DAY 1

- **11.00** Arrival in Checiny, and meeting with the tour guide.
- **11.15** Castle in Chęciny a medieval fortress located on Castle Hill offering an excellent panorama of Chęciny and the northern part of the Świętokrzyskie Mountains.
- **12.45** Czerwona Góra a monument of nature in a picturesque setting at a former mineral excavation site. Visitors can learn more about surface karst forms and the history of Sigismund's Column.
- **13.30** Jaskinia Raj the most beautiful Polish cave with amazingly rich flowstone features and other outstanding underground karst formations.
- **17.00** Transport to the hotel, and check-in.
- **18.00** Dinner.





DAY 2

From Miedzianka to Zachełmie

- 8.00 Breakfast.
- **9.00** Setting off for sightseeing.
- **10.00** Miedzianka an impressive highpoint dominating the surroundings with an elevation of 354 m above sea level. It's famous for its beautiful panorama of the Święto-krzyskie Mountains, its delightful flora and rare minerals, such as azurite and malachite.
- **11.30** Góra Zelejowa, also known as the Świętokrzyski Eagle's Perch while hiking along this trail, visitors can see interesting surface karst formations, traces of mining works and rich flora.
- 13.00 Ślichowice is a remarkable nature reserve in Kielce.

- A former quarry, it boasts a spectacular mountainous location and unique tectonic rock formations, such as a recumbent fold.
- **14.30** The historic Bartek oak tree is one of the oldest oaks in the country, a symbol of Świętokrzyski flora which is estimated to be around 1,000 years old. The tree is 31 metres in height and has a circumference around the trunk of 14 metres at ground level.
- **15.30** Zachełmie is one of the newest and most beautiful of the Świętokrzyski nature reserves. It is famous for the remains of a tetrapod discovered there, its interesting geological structure and other rock formations which encapsulate the history of the Earth. Departure for home.


